For over ten years I was the only ACC approved Maaori sexual abuse counsellor in Taranaki. I withdrew from this approval eight years ago when ACC began to introduce the new criteria based on the DSM4 which moved applicants into a medical/mental health assessment for the effects of criminal behaviour endured in a social setting. I have however continued to offer counselling to our people in this arena, on request.

I have been facilitating family violence education programmes to protected persons women since 1997 and prior to this date; children 1998 and male respondents 2000.
